How to: Lead Contact Groups

Contact Groups: Places of widening relationships

Contact Groups are an expression of church, made up of a mixture of those with faith, and those who are exploring faith. The groups are organised for, and informed by being relevant to those exploring faith. As such, they cover a wide range of contexts and often don't seem very traditionally 'churchy'. There may be a range of 'preliminary' activities or groups which may feed into or emerge into contact groups which help people explore faith. Contact groups begin with around 3-6 Christians, and over time includes others who are warm to finding out about Jesus. They meet in a variety of ways, places and frequency depending on what is relevant to those who are not Christians.

Below are a list of principles for leading Contact groups and possibilities for how they might look:

Principles

- Missional these groups are set up for the purpose of helping people explore the Christian faith (less Christians per group)
- Relevant, accessible and flexible
- Creative exploring new shared mission ventures
- Community and Bible used along the way appropriately
- Hospitality is important!
- May evolve into a Connect Group as people grow in faith

Contact Leaders:

- Set a culture of widening relationships
- Look for what the Spirit is doing in mission, where the new frontiers and connections are
- Think outside the box for what 'church' may look like
- Create places where faith can be explored; bible reading and prayer which is accessible and relevant to those exploring.
- Encourage and facilitate hospitality; create sustainable patterns of community
- Maintains sustainability (lightweight) and looks for ways to grow and multiply the group

- Engages with a Community, and encourages group members to do the same as becomes appropriate.
- Is accountable to the BLT and is huddled regularly

Possibilities (how it might look):

- Follow the Godsend app as a starting point for prayerfully discovering the missional opportunities God is giving you
- Use the 7P's of finding, defining and refining your missional focus. (in the Discipleship in a nutshell booklet)
- Follow the 6 Rhythms to make disciples: 1. Know the Story, 2. Listen, 3. Celebrate, 4. Eat, 5. Bless, 6. ReCreate.
- Discovery Bible Study. What's God saying? What are we going to do about it?

Example Contact Groups:

- Joining a sports team (or any other social grouping) together with the aim to love people and share faith.
- Garden of Hope, joining the plan for mission there.
- Focus on a school, club, library, coffee shop or other place of peace, becoming regulars who are missionaries in that space..
- Connecting to an existing social action project. Foodbank, Foodhub, Hope Into Action etc and praying and working towards sharing faith together in that context. (Read Social Action and Faith Sharing by Andy Frost £3.)
- Gathering people to explore faith using Alpha, Story of God, The Chosen or other relevant tools.
- Connect to an existing church event or project as prayer and mission support.
- And many more ideas you have or Holy Spirit is waiting to reveal...
